## Person-Centered Age-Friendly Care Measures



In January 2025 the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) launched the *Inpatient Quality Reporting Program* that is grounded in the Age-Friendly Health Systems and includes the 4Ms (what matters, medication, mentation and mobility). The CMS Age Friendly Hospital Measure advances the movement of **Age-Friendly Health Systems** vision to ensure older American adults receive evidence-based, age-friendly care that aligns with what matters most to the person, family and caregiver.

Currently, there are close to 5,000 care sites across the country that have been recognized as an Age-Friendly Health System. Inpatient hospital and long-term care settings who utilize the CMS reporting metrics provide transparency to the public so older adults, families and caregivers can choose health systems that focus on age friendly care.

The Multiple Chronic Conditions Resource Center recently released a new podcast with Dr. Cheryl Phillips MD, AGSF Senior Health Consultant with the John A. Hartford Foundation where she discusses the 4Ms impact on person-centered care planning for persons with or at risk for multiple chronic conditions. She highlights the new CMS measure and the opportunity for health systems to promote age-friendly healthcare in the U.S.
